Red Leaf Releases First Anthology





NEW Collections from Red Leaf

Off to Camp! by **Teresa Richert** is a collection of 14 nature-inspired solos for the beginning pianist, most with lyrics and many with teacher duets. Includes 2 composition exercises to inspire student creativity.



Strong and Free, **Joanne Bender's** Canada 150 project, contains fresh, attractive pieces for the elementary pianist. Joanne Bender also introduces **Green Earth Suite** containing 4 pieces for tenor saxophone and piano.



The Lion's Tale by **Martha Hill Duncan** – Designed for the early reader, these piano solos are intended to explore contemporary sounds and colours while maintaining ease and speed in learning. Some of the pieces provide more straightforward reading challenges while others will work better with a "read and rote" approach. The collection was inspired by Tenley Dyck and the Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music's Composers & Kids program.

Bev Porter is adjudicating the student compositions for both **ORMTA** and **NBRMTA**.

When The Piano Sings! - May 27 Owen Sound, ON, June 7 – 10 Festival for Creative Pianists, Denver, Co., Sept 9 Niagara Falls, ON. **Martha Hill Duncan** will lead a detailed discussion and exploration into the benefits of the addition of vocal imagery into the piano lesson. Refined pedal techniques, dynamics, phrasing, articulation, balance and sound production will be discussed using this powerful, expressive and intuitive approach. This workshop will also include a mini-tour of Martha's own piano compositions that are used by students today and will detail her inspiration as well as some helpful teaching and interpretive tips. Martha is also adjudicating on May 27 in Owen Sound, ON and June 7 – 10 Festival for Creative Pianists, Denver, Co.

Red Leaf Pianoworks will be offering a review and performance of its new and most popular music collections in a joint presentation with Darlene Irwin of "The Student Music Organizer and other essential teaching aids." This presentation will be offered at the following locations over the next few months: **COSMO Music Store in Richmond Hill**, Ontario on June 28, **Remenyi Music Store in Toronto** on July 5, and at **Long & McQuade Music Store in London, Ontario** on September 8.

On July 17 & 18, **Red Leaf Pianoworks** will have a trade table at the **CNCM Summer Sizzle** conference in Mount Forest, Ontario.

John Burge will be presenting two, 90-minute sessions at the **Royal Conservatory of Music's Summer-Summit** in Calgary on the weekend of August 26-27. In the first session he will discuss ways to find inspiration through creativity in music, in his talk, "10 Approaches to Creativity: A Canadian Composer Works with a Snowdrift." The second session will be a lecture/performance of the entire set of Burge's "Twenty-four Prelude," for solo piano, with the composer at the keyboard. In addition, the RCM will have many sessions ranging from pedagogy to performance practices to advice for RCM Examination preparation. More information can be found on the web.

On September 9th – **Keyed Up Conference in Niagara Falls** will have a trade table and **Martha Hill Duncan** will be a featured Presenter at the conference.

Peter Rudzik was commissioned by ARMTA to write an intermediate piano piece for students in celebration of Canada 150 and ARMTA 85. It will be published by Palliser Music Publishing and performed at the **Music Conference Alberta 2017**. The result is *The Gypsy Daisy* based on a Canadian Folk song.

Recent Events

Performances

Susan Griesdale recently presented a workshop entitled “**Don’t be Afraid to Teach Composition to your Students**” to both the ORMTA Newmarket branch (March 31st) and the Central Toronto branch (May 26th). Available as part of the ORMTA’s Clinician’s list of Workshops and Presenters.

Sixty Fingers by **Susan Griesdale** – a sextet for two pianos, 12 hands – was performed in Toronto as a special recital held at Robert Lowrey’s Piano Experts Piano store. Performed by Les Six piano ensemble – all students of Toronto teacher Susan Hamblin Dennis.

We are Canadians by **Susan Griesdale** – in honour of Canada’s 150th birthday! This children’s anthem was performed in April 19th by the Alliston Union Public School at the South Simcoe Music Festival in Alliston Ontario and will also be performed on June 19th by the school children’s choir, directed by Jennifer Wilson in Uxbridge Ontario.

In April, **Janet Gieck** had performances of her **Alleluia: Paramount Jesus** for SATB choir by Resound in Vanguard, SK. There was also a premier of her new string quartet piece called **Lament** at Millar College of the Bible in Pambrun, SK. Janet led a masterclass in Bentley, AB where students also presented a recital of her compositions.

John Burge was in Saskatoon on May 13, 2017 to hear the premiere performance of **Four Seasons of the Canadian Flag**, for full orchestra. This work is joint commission by the National Youth Orchestra of Canada, the Saskatoon Symphony Orchestra and The Kingston Symphony Orchestra in tribute of Canada’s 150th anniversary of Confederation with funding provided by the Ontario Arts Council. This music is based on the four paintings having the same titled that were created by artist Max Newhouse artist in honour of the 10th anniversary of the Canadian flag in 1975. The original renderings of the flags are each 8 feet wide and 5 feet high and Max holds the patent on the collective image. Max was kind enough to endorse Burge’s musical interpretation of the paintings in four concise movements and Max even painted for John Burge a small single canvas of the four flags as shown in the photo. The representation of Summer, Fall, Winter and Spring with the appropriate physical condition of the maple leaf is simultaneously simple and profound and can be quickly appreciated by any Canadian who has enjoyed, endured and sometimes just survived, the changing seasons. With exact dates and cities still to be announced, the National Youth Orchestra of Canada will play this work at least six times in locations across Canada this summer. The Kingston Symphony will perform the piece later in October.



The very first Isabel Overton-Bader Canadian Violin Competition at Queen’s University’s Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts commissioned **John Burge** to compose the required test piece for all semi-finalists to perform. John titled the resultant solo violin work, **Twitter Etudes No. 1**—a six-minute work consisting of six short etudes with each etude containing 140 notes. Performers of the work are given the option of playing the six etudes in any order and it was remarkable how the semi-finalists’ interpretations differed. The semi-finalists’ performances can be found on YouTube.

Adjudicating

Susan Griesdale adjudicated at the Sunderland Lions Club Music Festival, Grey County Kiwanis Music Festival and Newmarket Lions Club Music Festival.

Janet Gieck adjudicated piano in Carnduff, SK in March.

Rebekah Maxner adjudicated Junior Piano at the Halifax Kiwanis music festival from March 30 – April 3.

Martha Hill Duncan adjudicated March 28-April 1 at the Peel Music Festival and April 24-29 at the Calgary Performing Arts Festival.

John Burge was a piano and composition adjudicator for both the Edmonton Kiwanis Music Festival and the Newmarket Lions Club Festival this past spring.

Joanne Bender enjoyed adjudicating for the Canada Music Week festival in Brantford, Ontario.








